ADOPTER'S AGREEMENT

- I agree that the dog is being adopted for myself and will not be sold, adopted, or given to another party. _____ (initial)
- I agree to care for the dog in a humane manner and be a responsible animal guardian. This includes supplying quality food, clean water, adequate shelter from wind, rain and sun, attention, and medical care. _____ (initial)
- I agree to keep the dog current with vaccinations, monthly heartworm, flea and tick preventative. _____(initial)
- I agree that if the dog is to be kept outside, it will be in a secure fenced area with plenty shade and exercise area. _____(initial)
- I agree to never “chain” my dog. _____(initial)
- I agree to never abandon this dog or to surrender it to a city or county shelter. If, for any reason, I can no longer care for this pet, I AGREE TO RETURN MY PET TO Save Our Shepherds German Shepherd Rescue. _____(initial)

- I understand that I may return my pet within 5 days for a full refund of my donation. If I return my pet after 5 days, my donation is non-refundable. _____(initial)
- I understand that while SOS German Shepherd Rescue attempts to gain as much knowledge about each animal as possible and to pass this knowledge to each potential adopter, SOS may not know the true history of any of its rescues or how this rescued dog will act in a new environment. ____ (initial)
- I understand and accept that changes in this pet’s environment may cause stress, which may result in “accidents” or some behavioral difficulties, especially for the first week or two following the adoptions. I am willing to work with my new pet with patience and understanding, and at no time will subject this pet to violence or cruelty. _____(initial)
- I understand that SOS German Shepherd Rescue does not make any guarantees as to the health, background, temperament, or ultimate size of any rescue and thus cannot be held liable for any incidents related to this dog. _____(initial)
- I give the rescue organization permission to call my home at any reasonable time to assure that the animal is being properly treated and cared for. _____ (initial)
- I agree to keep SOS German Shepherd Rescue informed of my current home address and phone number. _____ (initial)
- I agree that all statements I have made on this form are true. If it is found that any statements I have made on this form are not true the adopted animal can be confiscated. _____(initial)

FEEDING YOUR RESCUE DOG

The majority of those associated with SOS German Shepherd Rescue choose to feed our own dogs the “prey model raw” or BARF (Biologically Appropriate Raw Food) diet. We realize this is not for everyone but encourage our new adoptive families to investigate that option. Otherwise, we encourage you to feed the best quality kibble you can afford. See our website www.SaveOurShepherds.org to learn more about the ingredients in common brands of dog food and the dietary needs of all dogs.

TIPS FOR SWITCHING DOG FOODS

Things You'll Need:

- A measuring cup
- The old food
- The new food

- Cooked white rice and/or a tablespoon of canned pumpkin [not pie filling] may be added to the food to add in digestion.
- If the dog's stomach does get upset, a meal of rice and plain cooked chicken is recommended. Of course, remove any cooked bones!
- If he or she continues to have diarrhea or throw up, discontinue the new food and contact your vet.

If possible, it's best to transition from wet food to wet, dry to dry, or mixture to mixture. The key is to keep the form of the food the same.

For Kibble: Switch the food gradually, over a period of a week or so. Start with a mixture of 25% new and 75% old and feed that for two or three days, then step it up to 50-50, and finally end up with a combo of 75% new, 25% old. If you don't detect any changes in their digestion over the week's time, you can start feeding the new food exclusively. Congratulations on bringing home your new family member!
